

## 4.04 ANOTHER KING IS CHOSEN

### 1 SAMUEL 15, 16

Samuel had been a judge of the Israelites for many years. Then, the people wanted a king instead of a judge to rule them. God showed Samuel a man named Saul. Saul became the first king of Israel.

Although Saul won lots of battles for the land of Israel, Saul was not a good king. He did not obey God. He would do some of what God told him to do, but would sometimes just do what he, Saul, wanted to do. God told Samuel, "I am sorry that I made Saul king of Israel. ## **4.04 ANOTHER KING IS CHOSEN - TEACHER'S GUIDE**

### **1 SAMUEL 15, 16**

#### **HIGHLIGHTS:**

- 1) Saul was chosen as the first king of Israel. He was not an obedient king. God told Samuel that He was sorry for making Saul the king.
- 2) God told Samuel to go to a man named Jesse, who was from Bethlehem. Jesse had eight sons. God would tell Samuel which one to pick to be the next king.
- 3) Samuel took an animal with him for a sacrifice. He invited Jesse and his sons and also leaders of the town to come with him as he made the sacrifice.
- 4) Samuel looked at seven of Jesse's sons. But God told Samuel that none of these sons was the one God had chosen. Jesse said there was one more son in the fields watching the animals. This son's name was David. When David came in from the fields, God told Samuel that this was the man He had chosen to be king.
- 5) Samuel poured oil, a sign of the Holy Spirit of God, over David's head, as the Lord had told him to do. Then, the Holy Spirit came upon David, which meant that God's power was with him. As the Holy Spirit came upon David, the Holy Spirit departed from King Saul.
